WHAT ARE CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES?

The State Government provides funding for staffing, facility maintenance and the core resources required to deliver the Western Australian Curriculum.

This funding is based on a range of factors, including student enrolment numbers, student characteristics and the school's funding allocation. Voluntary Contributions and Charges help Mount Lawley Senior High School enhance educational programs beyond the resources provided through government funding.

Funds received from families contribute to the purchase of additional learning resources, specialised equipment, consumable materials and enhanced educational opportunities that support student learning and achievement. The school is committed to keeping costs as low as possible while ensuring students have access to high-quality learning experiences.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES?

Voluntary Contributions (Years 7–10)

The School Board has approved a voluntary contribution of \$235 per student for students in Years 7 to 10, in accordance with Department of Education policy. These contributions support the provision of additional learning resources, textbooks, digital resources, library materials and classroom consumables that enhance teaching and learning across all learning areas.

Payment of the voluntary contribution is appreciated and enables the school to continue providing high-quality educational programs for all students.

Compulsory Charges (Years 7–10)

Compulsory charges apply only where students choose to participate in optional educational programs, specialist programs, electives, excursions, incursions or other activities that incur additional costs.

These charges cover the actual cost of consumable materials, specialised equipment, venue hire, transport and other resources directly associated with the activity or program.

Compulsory Charges (Years 11–12)

Students in Years 11 and 12 undertake courses with varying resource requirements. Charges are based on the actual cost of materials, resources, equipment and services required to deliver each course. As a result, charges will vary depending on the courses selected by each student.

Course charges are compulsory and are calculated in accordance with the Department of Education's Contributions, Charges and Fees policy, ensuring that students pay no more than the actual cost of providing the materials and services required for their chosen courses.

PAYMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

An estimate of Contributions and Charges is provided to families prior to the commencement of each school year, based on the student's current enrolment and subject selections.

Any adjustments resulting from timetable or subject changes will be reflected in the final charges. Payments may be made in full or through an approved payment plan. The school encourages families experiencing financial difficulty to contact the Administration Office to discuss suitable payment arrangements.

Payment Options

Payments can be made using any of the following methods:

1. **Credit or Debit Card** (Visa and Mastercard accepted).
2. **Direct Deposit** using internet banking. Please use your child's full name as the payment reference.
3. **BPOINT Online Payments** using the secure online payment facility.
4. **Payment Plans**, which can be arranged by contacting the Administration Office.
5. **Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS)**, for eligible families. Information regarding eligibility and applications is available on the school website.

Please note that some courses, activities or programs may require payment, or a deposit, prior to commencement to cover the cost of materials, equipment or services. Students participating in work placements, excursions, incursions or other fee-based activities may also be required to pay associated costs before the activity begins.

The continued support of parents and carers through the payment of Contributions and Charges assists Mount Lawley Senior High School in providing high-quality educational opportunities and resources for all students. Thank you for your ongoing support.

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

Education Program Allowance and Clothing Allowance

The Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) provides financial assistance to eligible families with students enrolled in Years 7–12.

The scheme is available to parents and carers who hold one of the following:

- Services Australia Health Care Card
- Pensioner Concession Card
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (Blue Card)

Applications should be completed and returned to the school as early as possible during Term 1.

The Secondary Assistance Scheme consists of:

- Education Program Allowance – \$235 (paid directly to the school)
- Clothing Allowance – \$115 (paid either to the parent/carer or directly to the school)

Where allowances are paid directly to the school, funds will be allocated to compulsory Charges first, followed by Voluntary Contributions and any approved voluntary requests, unless otherwise directed.

Families who believe they may be eligible are encouraged to contact the School Administration Office for further information or assistance with the application process.

ATTENDANCE AT SECONDARY SCHOOL

At Mount Lawley Senior High School, we want your child to achieve their absolute best. Attending school every day gives them the best opportunity to learn and succeed.

The teenage years are a time for young people to develop independence and find their place in the world, including how they engage with school life. We recognise that some students may need extra encouragement to attend regularly. By working together, our school community can help address the reasons why young people may be reluctant to come to school.

Remember there are **40 weeks of school a year**.

Some **common problems** you may have getting your child to school:

- They won't get out of bed in the morning
- They go to bed late at night
- They take a long time to get ready in the morning
- They haven't done their homework or are avoiding a test or assignment
- They are using their phone or computer in their rooms during the night
- They are playing video games late at night.

What can **staff** at Mount Lawley Senior High School do to help?

- Offer relevant and culturally responsive learning opportunities
- Monitor every student's attendance and work with you to overcome problems affecting your child's attendance
- Talk with you about involving support staff such as school psychologist, chaplain, mentors and relevant staff
- Talk with you about local services they may also be able to help such as Headspace, Mercy Care and other organisations.

You may also **have concerns** that your child:


- May not have friends or is not fitting in
- May be feeling lost at school
- Fears being a failure
- Is not feeling academically challenged
- May have learning difficulties
- May not get along with a teacher
- Just not wanting to be at school.

What can **you do** to help?

- Act early. It is important to understand and work on the underlying reasons why your child is not going to school.
- On average, teenagers need eight to nine hours sleep a night to be healthy and alert. Maintaining a daily routine helps. This may include monitoring internet, mobile phone, computer games and television use at night to ensure sleep is not disturbed.
- Try not to make appointments or take holidays during school time. This can make it difficult to catch up on missed school-work, and cause anxiety about attending school.
- Don't let your child stay home unless they are genuinely sick.
- Don't let your child stay home to finish an assignment that is due. Make attendance the number one priority.
- Set a good example - how you meet your commitments impacts on how they will meet theirs. Teach them that 'showing up' to commitments is normal and expected behaviour.
- Have clear expectations about after school jobs. Make sure work does not impact on their ability to get to school each day or interfere with study.
- Encourage extracurricular activities such as sport and creative activities. They can help your child develop positive relationships and experience success, helping them feel more motivated.
- Monitor your child's attendance and learning at school. Periodically check with their teachers or the year coordinator to find out how things are going.
- Avoid taking over or giving your child the impression you are fighting their battles for them. Improving attendance requires the school, parent and student to work together.
- If your child delays getting ready for school so they are late, encourage them to still go to school with a note.
- Ask school staff such as the Student Support Coordinator or Student Support Officer for help if you are struggling to get your child to school.

Do you need to **let the school know** if your child will be away from school?

Yes you need to let the school know the reason why your child is going to be, or has been, absent from school as soon as possible by any one of the following:

Don't feel the need to 'cover up' the reason for your child's absence. This reinforces that you are taking over when things are difficult. Be honest so we can work with you and your child to improve their attendance.

Having information about why your child is missing school helps us plan for their return, and to work out whether we can provide any further help to you.

It's **NOT OK** to miss school if your child:

- Is celebrating a birthday
- Is going on a family holiday
- Is visiting a family or friends
- Has slept in or had a big weekend
- Is looking after other children
- Has sport or other recreational activities that have not been approved by the school
- Has appointments such as haircuts, driving lessons and minor check ups
- Has a pet is who is sick
- Attended after hours school activities
- Didn't complete homework or assignments
- Stay home/leave early to study for a test/exam.

When is it **OK NOT TO GO** to school?

An **OK** reason is one that prevents your child from getting to school. This could include:

- When your child is sick or unwell
- Attending cultural or religious observances such as EID and funerals.
- An unavoidable natural event such as flood waters, fire or a cyclone.
- An unavoidable medical appointment

The Principal decides if the reason given for your child's absence is acceptable.

PROPERTY AND MEDICAL INSURANCE INFORMATION

The Department of Education does not provide personal accident insurance for students, nor does it provide cover for lost, stolen or damaged private property.

If a student's personal property is lost, stolen or damaged, the school is unable to replace these items or purchase replacements using public funds. Responsibility for replacing private property rests with parents and carers. Families are therefore encouraged to ensure they have appropriate personal or household insurance cover.

Parents and carers are also responsible for the cost of any medical treatment required by an injured student, including ambulance services. Student accident insurance policies are available from a range of insurers and may provide cover for medical expenses and ambulance costs. Families may wish to consider purchasing this type of policy.

Insurance is also available for personal items such as laptops, mobile phones and other electronic devices. Many computer suppliers can provide information about insurers that offer cover for these items.

Please note that some household insurance policies do not cover personal belongings taken outside the home. Parents and carers should check their existing policies to ensure they understand what is and is not covered.

HEALTHY ACTIVE PROGRAM

The Healthy Active Program has been developed around the Western Australian Health Promoting Schools Framework. It provides alternative opportunities for students to engage with school life while promoting positive physical and mental health outcomes.

The program aims to provide activities and initiatives that appeal to all students, particularly those who may not traditionally participate in school sporting teams or other health-related activities.

Healthy Active encourages a whole-school approach to health and wellbeing. Mount Lawley Senior High School is an official Act Belong Commit Mentally Healthy School, with the program supporting student wellbeing through a range of after-school activities, in-school programs and health promotion initiatives. The school's Breakfast Club also forms an important part of this program.

The initiative has been recognised with Excellence Awards for Health and Physical Activity from the Australian Council for Health, Physical Education and Recreation (ACHPER).

Established in 2009 with funding from the Australian Government Department of Health and Ageing, the program has continued to thrive through the support of families via the Voluntary Approved Requests component of the school's annual Contributions and Charges. With your continued support, the school will be able to offer new and ongoing Healthy Active opportunities throughout 2027.

Who Are The Cadets? Our Bush Ranger Cadet Unit is made up of students from Year 7 all the way through to Year 11 (we kick them out at the end of Year 11 due to the nature and busyness of Year 12). All they have to do is sign up, participate and attend regularly and they can get involved in all of the activities and camps we engage in over the year.

Funding Our funding comes from the Department of Communities through Cadets WA, and as a result, we do not charge the Cadets for participation in any of our activities - it's free!

When Can The Cadets Join? We intake new Cadets at the start of Term 1 and Term 3 only. We do not let people join mid-way through a semester. This is mostly because we want the groups to get to know each other as well as possible, and because we work the Cadets progressively towards their camping experiences. We also don't want to take 'un-prepared' people away into the wilderness.

Who Are The Instructors? Our Instructors are usually (but not always) teachers who volunteer their time after school on Mondays and at camps. They need to have a Working With Children Card, be signed off by the Principal and be registered with Cadets WA as Instructors. Instructors have also included local youth workers, parents and past Cadets.

There are three main parts to our Cadet Program

Mondays

The Cadets meet after school each Monday during Term from 3:00pm to 5:00pm. During these sessions we work on team building, leadership and get-to-know-you activities, show them how to use our equipment and look at various aspects of the Western Australian environment and the work of the Parks & Wildlife Service.

Camps

Each term the whole Unit undertakes a camp. These run for 3 or 4 days and are usually between 1 and 7 hours drive from Perth. During camp we try to engage the Cadets in the local area they are visiting and to participate in community service activities.

Expeditions

Our expeditions are offered to senior Cadets, and are the pinnacle of our camping program. Usually 7-10 days long they travel long distances or stay in a particular region for an extended period of time. Our 'Trips' take us on an extended journey and our 'Experiences' give the Cadets the opportunity to work intensively with the local Rangers in a particular region.
